PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Marion County Public Health Department (MCPHD) Ryan White Services Program (RWSP) is designed to address the needs of people living with HIV (PLWH) in the Indianapolis Transitional Grant Area (TGA), including those out of care and/or who are historically underserved or uninsured. The program assists clients who are out-of-care gain access to points of entry; provides a comprehensive continuum of care for PLWH; and complies with the National HIV/AIDS Strategy (NHAS) to fulfill the goals of the HIV Continuum of Care. RWSP uses funding to increase access and utilization of core medical and support services; helps clients remain in care to optimize health outcomes; decreases disparities in accessing medical care; reduces community viral loads and optimizes the quality of life for PLWH throughout the TGA.

HIV CARE CONTINUUM

Diagnosed:

A barrier along the HIV care continuum is knowledge of HIV status. The NHAS goal is that 95% of HIV-positive individuals be diagnosed and seroaware.

Linkage to Care:

Delayed linkage and poor engagement in care are associated with increased risk of secondary HIV transmission; quicker progression to AIDS; drug resistance; and increased morbidity and mortality.

Retained in Care:

Retention in care is thought to be underreported in the TGA. Medical visits are not reportable by law; therefore, only HIV labs can be used to reliably calculate this outcome in the TGA. Furthermore, if an individual living with HIV faces high deductible or co-pays, attends regular HIV care visits, and is ART compliant, he or she may opt to receive only a single, annual viral load test to confirm continued suppression.

Viral Load Suppression:

NHAS goal is that at least 95% of people diagnosed with HIV be virally suppressed.
